Short Course & Upskilling Program

Thank you for your interest in the availability of funding towards course fees provided by the Building and Construction Training Fund.

We acknowledge the support of the Construction Training Fund in reducing the cost of training for eligible workers.

We have included a reduced fee pricelist for your information so as you can see what courses have been included and the price they would be, should you qualify for funding.

The Construction Training Fund was established in 1990 by an Act of Parliament to support the training of eligible people in the building and construction industry. The Fund's goals are to improve the quality of training and increase the number of skilled workers in the building and construction industry.

Under the Building and Construction Industry Training Fund and Levy Collection Act 1990 the Construction Training Fund collects a small training levy from all construction projects in Western Australia. The funds received from the collection of the training levy go back to the industry to support training and skills development.

APPLICATION PROCESS: You will find the following forms attached:

Should you wish to apply you will need to complete the following steps:

Step 1: Determine your eligibility. (Refer to the attached Eligibility Guide)

Eligible individuals must be:

- Directly employed by residential, commercial, or civil construction companies undertaking relevant projects in Western Australia or
- Self employed and undertaking on site construction, installation and/or fabrication work
- Undertaking on site construction, installation or fabrication work via employment through sub contract and/or labour hire arrangements

Ineligible companies or individuals include:

- Government departments, agencies and their direct employees
- Companies that manufacture, supply or deliver building products and their employees

- Companies that manufacture, supply deliver or install NON building products after completion of the construction process and their employees
- Companies that maintain and inspect elevators and escalators and their employees
- Companies and their employees that provide maintenance or repairs of minor nature after the construction phase
- Carpet laying or floor covering companies and contractors

Step 2: Complete the attached two application forms:

- "Participant Eligibility Checklist" form and
- "Bulk Billing CTF Participant Information Required" form

Please complete the forms and be sure you understand this is a Declaration and the contacts you identify may be called to confirm your employment

Step 3: Submit your completed form to RMS

Once you have completed the form ensuring that all fields have been filled in including full address
details of the sites worked on and either deliver to reception or email to RMS at
reception@rmstraining.com.au for review

Step 4: Confirm eligibility decision from RMS

- RMS will review your application and determine your eligibility. Please allow up to 48hrs for processing.
- It will be your responsibility to contact RMS for information concerning the result of your application.

Step 5: Proceed to booking

• If deemed eligible you will be authorised to receive the course at a discounted rate and can proceed to book your desired course and pay the reduced fee.

Individual Claim

Should you have already completed your course and paid in full you can still claim and receive reimbursement if you are deemed eligible.

Those individuals that have paid full price for their course and were unemployed at the time of completing the course and have since gained employment in the construction industry within 12 months of completing their course can make an individual claim for reimbursement of the subsidy amount.

You will need to lodge an individual claim through the CTF portal at:

You will be required to register on the portal and create a password for your login.

Once logged in go to: "Submit a claim" then choose "Individual Claim"

Under Individual Claim select "**Training Claim**" You will be required to upload a paid invoice from RMS identifying the course and a "Statement of Attainment" for the course completed

You will also be required to select the unit of competency that you have achieved in your course from a drop down menu and as there are so many and not alphabetically listed we recommend you type the unit code into the search bar.

Eligibility

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What is 'construction work'?

Construction work means the processes of carrying out construction, erection, installation, reconstruction, re-erection, renovation, alteration, demolition, or maintenance* of or repairs to any of the following on a site: The Building and Construction Industry Training Fund and Levy Collection Act 1990 ("the Act") refers to definition of construction used in the Construction Industry Portable Paid Long Service Leave Act 1985

What construction work is excluded from the CTF Levy?

The following works are excluded from the CTF levy:

- Construction work which has a total value of \$20 000.00 (including GST) or less
- Work which is maintenance or repairs of a routine or minor nature carried out by employees for an employer whose primary activity is not related to the building and construction industry
- Agricultural work
- Government work
- Resources operational work.

Key points to note

Eligibility criteria

- Eligibility is determined by an individual's ability to demonstrate deployment in construction, installation and/or fabrication work on a construction site.
- Individuals who do not normally perform site-based works but are required from time to time to attend construction sites to carry out supervisory work as part of the construction process may be eligible to receive CTF rebates for OH&S training.

Who is ineligible for CTF's training subsidies?

Ineligible individuals and/or business and companies include:

- Government departments, agencies, and their direct employees
- Mining, oil, gas and mineral exploration companies and their employees
- Companies that manufacture, supply, or deliver building products and their employees
- Companies that manufacture, supply, deliver or install non-building products after completion of the construction process and their employees
- Companies that maintain and inspect elevators and escalators and their employees
- Companies and their employees that provide maintenance or repairs of a minor nature after the construction phase
- Carpet laying or floor covering companies and contractors.

What are the eligibility criteria if the participants are unemployed?

An unemployed individual seeking to claim a CTF training subsidy through our <u>Upskilling and Short Course Funding program</u> must be able to:

- Demonstrate that they have since the training secured employment/work in WA's construction industry within 12 months of completing the training: or
- Have written confirmation of employment by an eligible company or contractor in the construction industry, including a confirmed start date and pending successful completion of the training course.

Unemployed participants may be required to provide additional documentation to support any CTF claim.
